





## **BUNNY TOSS**



### What you need:

2 easter baskets1 stuffed bunny

#### What to do:

Take your egg toss to the next level by using a stuffed bunny and two easter baskets! Pick two players and have them stand ten steps apart. The first player takes the bunny and tosses it, underhanded, to the second player. That player attempts to catch the bunny in the basket. If successful, both players take one step back away from each other. The second player tosses the bunny. Players continue in this way until they miss a catch. Have another set of players take a turn and try to beat the last team's record.

Note: If you want to have more groups at the same time, purchase more baskets and bunnies so multiple groups can play at once.





## HOP - A - LONG



## What you need: 1 set of Plastic Eggs

### What to do:

In this relay race, players will move along the course by placing a plastic egg between their knees and hopping down to the end and back. If you have a smaller area, you may want the players to hop all the way around the room and back to the start. Have 2 or 3 players for each team. When the first player gets back to the start, he/she passes the egg to the next player and that player hops the course in the same way. The first team to have all players finish the course is the winner. Make the game more difficult by not allowing players to hold the egg in place with their hands.





## EGG UP



# What you need: 2 Inflatable Eggs Stopwatch/Clock

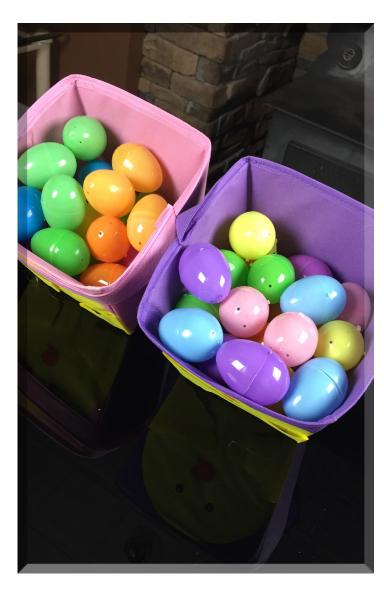
### What to do:

This is a group game that everyone can play. The object of the game is to keep the inflatable easter egg up (in the air) as long as possible. For the first round, allow players to use every part of their bodies to keep the egg from touching the ground. For the second round, allow players to use any body part except their hands (arms, chests, heads, legs, and every other part are acceptable.) For the last round, have all the players sit on the ground, and players can only use their legs and heads to keep the egg in the air. Because the egg is a different shape, it will have a crazy bouncing pattern, so make sure your area is clear!





### EGG FIND



What you need:
3 Sets of 18 Plastic Eggs
2 Easter Baskets
Easter Points (next page)

### What to do:

Before the game begins, fill each egg with a slip of paper that has a point value. Separate the eggs into two baskets. Split into two teams of at least 3 players (for 2 teams, you want around 30 eggs--you can add more teams if you have more eggs). Place the eggs at the back of the room in a pile, and the baskets and players at the front. Each team should line up. On "go," the first player from each team runs to the back and grabs an egg, brings it to the front, and places it in the team's basket. When passing the line, he tags the next player, who runs and does the same. Play continues for 60 seconds. At the end of one minute, open the eggs, count the points, and the team with the most points wins!







## EGG-MANIA



What you need:
5 Sets of 18 Plastic Eggs
Masking Tape or 4 Buckets

### What to do:

This is a group game that everyone plays. Separate your group into 4 roughly equal teams. (If you have quite a few children, you may want to get more eggs and separate into more groups). Each team receives either a bucket, or you can mark out a 2'x2' square for each team around the outside of the playing area (this works best if the playing area is a square, and each team's box is on one of the four sides of the square). In the center of the playing area, place a pile of all the eggs. This game lasts two minutes. The objective is for each team to get the most eggs into its bucket/area in that time. Team members may take from the center pile, or go and grab an egg from another team's area. Players may only hold one egg at a time (or else they are disqualified). At the end of 2 minutes, count up each team's eggs, and the team with the most wins.
